#### MAKE BAKE & SHOW 2018

Continuing to share with you clarification of further points arising from the schedule.

- Handmade Afternoon Tea Apron any medium (waist apron, no bib) can be either hand sewn, or machine sewn. The schedule did not state "hand stitched". The apron cannot be bought as a plain apron and frills, pockets etc. added by the exhibitor. It will be marked "not according to schedule".
- Knitted Nursery Rhyme Character maximum height 12ins (single character only) If other knitted accessories are added to the character they will only be displayed if there is sufficient space.
- Novice Category (if a member has entered a Cookery, Craft, Art, Cards or Flowers Category in any Lincolnshire South Federation Show (including the Lincolnshire Show) they are unable to enter that particular class under the Novice Category in Make Bake and Show 2018)
- Embroidered Bookmark not cross stitch Schedule does not state "no kit" thus kit can be used.
- Cross Stitch Child's Birthday Card Schedule does not state "no kit" thus kit can be used.

Judges will be made aware of the queries and decisions before judging takes place.
