### **Recipe Corner**

**Sweet Rum Bites** 

Makes 24

165g sultanas

125ml rum

250g rich tea biscuits

1 tin condensed milk (397g)

2 tablespoons cocoa powder

Desiccated coconut for rolling

- 1. Soak sultanas in rum overnight.
- 2. Mix crushed biscuits, sultanas, milk and cocoa together in a large bowl. Chill for at least 2 hours.
- 3. Using your hands form small balls of the mixture and roll in the coconut.
- Keep refrigerated.
  Could be used as a homemade gift for a friend in a small box or cellophane bag.
