AROUND THE COUNTY

Denman College Visit - I was very disappointed when the Lincs South Federation visit to Denman in August was cancelled due to lack of support, as I was so keen to have a go at "Glass on Glass Mosaics". When I discovered there were other members equally keen to go, and that we could claim travel costs from the Agnes Salter Travel Fund for a car of 3 people, I set about organising the trip to Marcham. It was my sixth visit and as always, I had a wonderful time. I had a ground floor room, with an ensuite shower, in one of the cottages "Gallia", just a stone's throw from the workshops. As



always, the food was excellent, with a really good choice at each meal, with home-made shortbread with our morning coffee, and cake with afternoon tea. We arrived Monday afternoon, which began with introductions, dinner then the first class in the evening. Within half an hour we were learning techniques to cut glass, and before the end of the evening we were cutting circles – quite a skill! We selected our project either a dragonfly or a turtle. I chose a turtle because I thought it looked easier, but there was a lot more cutting than with the dragonfly! After breakfast on Tuesday I was busy cutting my turtle pieces, and gluing them into place, on a glass tile, then filling in with small glass chips to create the mosaic. The next process was to use grout to fill in the gaps, which was tricky as the chips, if not glued firmly, came out. Overnight the grout was left to dry, and on Wednesday I cleaned off the surplus grout and buffed the mosaic to a shine. I was very proud of my completed piece. There were 8 of us in the glass class and each person produced a very individual piece – the colours and variations were all amazingly beautiful. The instructor, Karen Jones, was very talented, and very patient! During the coffee break on Wednesday morning we had entertainment in the form of a choir, who had spent the last 2 days "Singing summer with the Beatles". Other courses taking place while we were there included needle felting garden birds, silver jewellery and a dressmaking class - it was great to see what other ladies were doing. If you have never been to Denman do consider it – it may seem expensive, but is a special treat, with all the tuition, a piece of completed work to take home, and excellent food it is a few days well spent. Don't forget, Denman can also be used as a B&B if you need accommodation in the Oxford area.
