PUBLIC AFFAIRS AND EDUCATION

Belton Park Ladies' Lunch

On 24th May, 96 ladies from across our Federation gathered at Belton Park Golf Club for a long-awaited ladies' lunch. The staff at the golf club worked tirelessly to provide us with an excellent lunch and friendly service, despite there being far fewer of them to cope with this large group than would normally be the case, due to the shortages currently being experienced across the hospitality industry.





Our speaker was The Rt Hon the Baroness Hogg, Viscountess Hailsham – Sarah Hogg. Sarah was the first woman ever to chair a FTSE 100 company (3i Group in 2002) and was head of the No.10 Policy Unit for Sir John Major from 1990-95. She started her career at The Economist; wrote for The Times, the Sunday Times and the Daily Telegraph. She helped to start The Independent and was one of the first presenters of Channel 4 News. Having been granted a life peerage in 1995, as Baroness Hogg of Kettlethorpe, she sits on the cross benches of the House of Lords.

Sarah's subject was her book "Katherine's House: A Story of Ghosts", which was published in 2019. It tells the story of Kettlethorpe Manor, home of Katherine Swynford, where Sarah and her husband live. Sarah explained to us how she had structured the book, combining fiction and fact by turn, to give a picture of a *house* and a district from medieval times to the present day. All agreed this was a fascinating subject and a long queue formed to purchase the book and have it signed by the author, so much so that orders had to be taken to accommodate the demand!



It was lovely to see so many ladies all together once more, enjoying a very sociable atmosphere, and we look forward to our next lunch, details of which are advertised with this newsletter.
