Recipes from the Trustees...

Iced Chocolate Traybake

Thank you Mary Berry – this is a brilliant recipe and (so far) has never failed me!

4 level tablespoons cocoa powder
4 tablespoons hot water
225g softened butter
225g caster sugar
275g self-raising flour
2 level teaspoons baking powder
4 large eggs
1 tablespoon milk



For the icing and decoration:

4 tablespoons apricot jam 150g plain chocolate 6 tablespoons water 350g sifted icing sugar 1 teaspoon sunflower oil Chocolate Flake(s)

- 1 Preheat the oven to 180°C/Fan 160/Gas 4. Grease a 30 x 23 cm traybake or roasting tin, then line the base with baking parchment
- 2 Blend together the cocoa and hot water, allow to cool slightly.
- 3 Measure all the cake ingredients into a large bowl and beat until well blended. Turn the mixture into the prepared tin and level the top
- 4 Bake in pre-heated oven for about 35-40 mins or until the cake has shrunk from the sides of the tin and springs back when pressed with your fingertips. Leave to cool in the tin.
- 5 Make the icing. First, warm the apricot jam in a pan and brush all over the cake. Break the chocolate into pieces and melt in a pan with the water, heating gently until melted and smooth. Leave to cool slightly, then beat in the icing sugar and oil. Pour over the cake and smooth over gently with a palette knife. Leave to set for about 30 mins.
- 6 Cut into 21 pieces and decorate with chocolate flakes.

Clímate Ambassadors



We're pleased to hear that the sale of peat compost will be banned from 2024! Environment Secretary George Eustice has announced a new consultation, to be held by the end of the year, on banning composts made of peat. Many gardeners don't realise that multi-purpose compost, unless it's labelled 'peat free', contains between about 70 per cent and 100 per cent peat. It is estimated that we use a total of three billion litres of peat every year in the UK alone.

The Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust has details of how to be peat free <u>here</u>, with details of where you can buy peat-free compost.

Globally peatlands could contain as much as 644 gigatons of carbon – one-fifth of all the carbon stored in soil on Earth. Not bad for a habitat that stakes a claim to just 3% of the planet's land surface. Peatland is the UK equivalent of the rain forests, absorbing and holding on to greenhouse gases, locking in billions of tonnes of carbon dioxide and methane.

The bad news is that more than 80 percent of UK peatlands are now damaged, and these collectively release 20 million tonnes of carbon dioxide and methane into the atmosphere annually. One tonne of CO2 is the equivalent of a plane trip to New York and back.



Some ecologists would argue that restoring peatlands is as important for natural habitat and capturing carbon has planting trees and reforestation. Peatlands also help prevent flooding, acting as sponges.

Peatlands are slow to create, only developing at a rate of 1mm per year. This makes them difficult and complex to restore. In Lincolnshire the Bourne North Fen project aims to restore 50 hectares of arable land to lost peat fenland. This is a Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust project and many other projects can be found on the IUCN website <u>here</u>. Peatlands take years to create and consequently many years to restore so our motto must be **LEAVE PEAT IN THE GROUND!**

"Make a Match, Make a Difference"

Currently, just 2% of the UK population is registered, so there is always a need for more people to sign up.

Thurlby and Dole Wood Walk

On Tuesday 18 May twelve members from LSFWIs set off on the second walk organised by the Federation. Led by Liz McIntosh everyone met in the car park of Thurlby Methodist Church before making their way down muddy paths, across fields, over styles and through gates to Dole Wood. The weather was at its best - warm and sunny. The wood was a riot of colour with an abundance of wildflowers: wild garlic, bluebells, cowslips, sweet violets, wood anemone and dog rose to name a few. The paths through the wood are well maintained with even a seat halfway to rest one's weary legs!

The wood is maintained by Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust and is mainly of Oak standards with Hazel Coppice. Birds were in abundance flitting through the trees enjoying the quietness including Great Spotted Woodpecker, Treecreeper, Whitethroat, Blackcap and Willow Warbler. Over 120 species of moth have been identified within the reserve. As well as many species of butterfly.

We continued our walk across more fields heading towards the busy A15 where we ended our walk with a drink at the local hostelry – The Horseshoe. And just as we sat down the weather changed and the rain came!

Please note that all walks are subject to change or cancellation or numbers may be curtailed dependent on circumstances, including any Covid restrictions. Places will be allocated by ballot if necessary.

To apply for a place on a walk either:

- <u>E-mail/BACS (preferred application method).</u> Send an e-mail to <u>events@lsfwi.org.uk</u> with the reference from the table above as the subject by the closing date for the walk you wish to attend. *Ensure that you include the 8 pieces of information requested overleaf.* DO NOT make a BACS payment until your place is confirmed when you will be sent the bank details and asked to *pay by 3 days prior to the event* to secure your place.
- <u>Cheque/letter.</u> If you need to pay by cheque, send your cheque payable to LSFWI the 8 pieces of information requested overleaf to LSFWI, Suite 10, Pattinson House, East Road Trading Estate, SLEAFORD NG34 7EQ to arrive prior to the closing date. Any cheques received where a place is not allocated will be destroyed.

To minimise costs, any WI able to consolidate applications into one cheque should do so but the information overleaf must be sent for each individual.

Walks Around the Federation PLEASE READ PRIOR TO APPLYING FOR A PLACE

All members must be aware they walk at their own risk and they are responsible for their own safety and happiness on the walk.

The walk leaders will lead the walk and will carry a small first aid kit but will not have specific medical training. The walk leaders will show their group the way on the walk but it is up to the individual to be careful in following them and to know their own capabilities and limitations.

You must carry a contact name and telephone number with you which could be used should the need arise. This may be stored on an unlocked mobile phone under the name "**ICE**" (In Case of Emergency) or be accessible as an Emergency Contact/Medical ID on a locked phone *e.g. for iPhone details are stored under Health, click on circle with your initials, Medical ID and Emergency Access needs to be set to Show When Locked.* You will be given the walk leader's mobile number on the day.

Should any member have any underlying health problems such as diabetes or asthma that may affect them during a walk or any medication that they may need, they must ensure that this is included in their application, ensure that appropriate medication is brought with them, and either the walk leader or a trusted companion knows what to do in the event of any problem.

All participants must arrive with:

• Suitable footwear i.e. trainers or walking shoes/boots

(Unless the route recce in the days prior to the event shows otherwise, trainers are sufficient for these walks but please consider the walk leader and before you pick up your loafers or flip flops that you may be perfectly capable of walking the distance in but the walk leader will not know that. She should not be put the difficult position of having to discuss it with you in case you cause a problem for the group as a whole)

- Water/fluid
- Any medication that might be needed
- Mobile phone that is switched on throughout the walk
- Suitable clothing for the day (e.g. a waterproof if wet, a sun/rain hat,)
- Suntan lotion applied if hot
