The amount of each prize will depend on the amount of the capital raised.



# Clímate Ambassadors

### Reducing our single use items, one step at a time



It's easy to get overwhelmed with information on how we can save the planet/reduce our carbon footprint/fight climate change so let's just follow the BBC approach to exam revision and do it 'bite size'.

If you use cotton wool pads or balls in your beauty routine, take a moment to consider the impact of this single use product with its high use of both water and pesticides in growing the cotton plants, chemicals in production and the plastic packaging that is generally used.

Yes, it is very easy; just buy/use/throw away but please consider swapping to mini washcloths. A quick rinse after use and throw in your washing machine every week or so – how easy is that?

We have a knitting and a crochet pattern attached if you are crafty, but there are washcloths available at Boots, Superdrug etc if not. These are often larger than you need so just get the scissors out and maybe sew the raw edges.

# **Constitutional Changes**

You will recall that at the end of last year we were asked to discuss changes to all WI constitutions. That is WI, federation and NFWI constitutions, to enable us all to comply with our Charity Commission obligations, mainly in connection with annual and special meetings. Following a Companies Act meeting in March, at which all WIs were represented by link delegates, a vote was held to accept these changes. Here is the result of voting for all constitutions;

• NFWI Articles of Association – 116 votes for, 0 votes against and therefore CARRIED with a 100% majority: effective immediately

• Incorporated Federation Articles of Association – 116 votes for, 0 votes against and therefore CARRIED with a 100% majority: effective upon adoption by incorporated (CLG) federations

• Unincorporated Federation Constitution & Rules – 116 votes for, 0 votes against and therefore CARRIED with a 100% majority: effective immediately

• WI Constitution & Rules – 8,133 votes for, 27 votes against and therefore CARRIED with a 99.67% majority: effective immediately

### **Archiving Information**

Sadly, we have been advised that, due to limited space at Lincolnshire Archives, the following items **can no longer be received:** 

- Textiles
- Scrapbooks
- Programmes
- Competition trophies
- Photographs

Lincolnshire Archives will, however, continue to hold WI records of meetings up to 35 years prior to suspension. However please include meeting record books over the past 35 years as they will be scanned into the Federation electronic filing system.

It should be noted that, with the downsizing of our office space, the Federation is much more restricted in its ability to store archive material of any sort. With immediate effect, please note that we will be able to store only **WI Records of Meetings.** We will no longer be able to accept Financial records other than the final accounts before the WI is closed. You should, therefore, ensure that your WI's old cheque book stubs, receipt books, and anything else containing members names and addresses that is over seven years old are completely destroyed (preferably by incineration or similar means).

We are keen to alleviate this increasing difficulty, so that we can maintain the important parts of our archive records.

### Therefore, from now on it would be much appreciated if WIs would, wherever possible, record monthly meetings digitally. This means that if, in future, a WI does have to close, meeting records can be sent to Federation Office for electronic archiving. If you would like to understand more about how to keep digital records, please contact the Federation office in the first instance.

# **April = MCS Month**

MCS stands for Membership Communication System

All WIs are encouraged to appoint an MCS Rep to take responsibility for their records, and WIs who already have an MCS Rep are asked to ensure that all their records remain accurate:

### Is where and when my WI meets correct?

#### Do members have an email address listed?

### Are all paid-up members listed?

### Are all members' details correct?

#### Are all lapsed members removed?

Are all officers' roles and committee positions assigned to the correct members?

The MCS enables communication throughout the organisation. When a new member joins, her details should be collected by her WI using the 'WI Member Registration Form' (available from federation office or to download from the MyWI>Running Your WI> Members resources) and added to the MCS. As soon as this is done she will be sent her new member's welcome pack and begin receiving WI Life.

- An accurate membership record will help NFWI **not** to send *WI Life* copies to those who are no longer WI members as this is a costly waste of resources.
- Access to **My WI** the dedicated members' only website is linked through the MCS to ensure that the site is only accessible to members. If a member wishes to take advantage of My WI she will require a valid and current email address entered on their MCS record.

### An MCS training session will be held later in the year!

### **SCAMS!! BE AWARE**

You cannot have missed the many items on the news regarding the increase in the number of scams that have taken place over the past 12 months.

### One of the latest one is **number spoofing.**

Scammers now have the technology to mimic an official telephone number so that it comes up on your called ID display (if you have one on your telephone). This can trick you into believing the caller is really from a legitimate organisation, such as a bank or utility company.

If you are in ANY doubt about the veracity of the caller, hang up and call the purported organisation directly. If possible, call them from a different 'phone, as scammers can keep the 'phone line open. In such a case, even if you hang up and then make another call, the line may still be connected to the scammer. If it is not possible to use another 'phone then wait for at least 10 minutes before making your call.

# Supporting victims of domestic abuse and their families for over 30 years

As the new Chair of the Board of Trustees for SoLDAS (Boston Women's Aid) and a fellow WI member I would like to take this opportunity to thank all LSFWIs who have supported local women's refuges especially ours in Boston with much needed donations.

But we are not just a refuge. I would like to take this opportunity to tell you about our Charity and the work we do. As well as providing a roof for families fleeing domestic abuse, we have a number of specialised services we deliver which includes: preventing future domestic abuse in the next generation with our work in schools; we have a volunteer mentor programme called 'Move on Together' which gives continuing support for victims on the road to recovery; in Holbeach we hold a weekly rural community hub which offers one to one direct support and we are in the process of widening this support to Spalding and Boston.

Men can be victims too! So, we work to overcome some of the barriers that prevent male victims seeking help and support. Our Freedom Programme helps women victims understand the effects of domestic abuse and feel empowered to move on.

The final one I want to mention is Great Days Out. Through our successful funding bid to Children in Need we are able to organise fun and educational day trips for families to enjoy and learn to do things as a family.

Due to Lockdown and Covid we have had to suspend receiving donations of goods and supplies as staff are working remotely from home. It is a difficult task, but it has helped us reduce our stock reserves. We also moved offices in the brief period when lockdown was lifted, but with a much smaller storage space which has restricted us from storing large quantities of goods.

Therefore, we are now using Facebook for example, to advertise when we need new help and provisions. So please register as a friend on Boston Women's Aid FB page and then you will be notified as and when we need donations; also, you'll receive regular updates on activities BWA are doing.

Maybe you would like to become a volunteer? If possible, I will share the pages to LSFWI FB page as well. If you want to respond to the requests, you can either do it direct or please contact me on blankcanvas.shelagh@gmail.com and I can help with distributions.

9 July 2021	Deadline for WIs to vote on the Annual Meeting resolutions. This will be done via an online form; however, an alternative means of casting votes will be available to WIs where it is not feasible to do this digitally.
August 2021	Mailing Results of the 202 I Annual Meeting resolution/s are announced in the August mailing.
September 2021	WI Life The 2021 Annual Meeting resolution/s are published in the September issue of WI Life.
